Supporting Healthcare during the Pandemic in the UK At the outbreak of the pandemic, few healthcare and first-response organisations were able to support their staff against the emotional toll of Covid-19. Since then, Angela has overseen the training of more than 700 people in key healthcare, air traffic control and aircrew support services.

Looking at the different phases of the pandemic the value of crisis intervention and the application of specific techniques will be discussed, including what worked, what did not, where challenges were posed and essential learning gained. It will emphasise that even basic care improved the lives of hospital staff at all levels.





We are in the fourth wave of the Covid-19 pandemic, and what seems like the longest marathon in history.

At the start, the Provincial Health Authority was exploring a peer support program for it's 50,000+ health care workers, but the sudden demand forced the coordinated training of key people committed to it's establishment.

What followed not only met the needs at the time but has become a sustainable model for all staff into the future.

The presentation will show how the standardized model of critical incident stress management (CISM) and the collaboration of regional and provincial mental health practitioners saw more than 200 physicians, nurses and paramedics trained to address the longest critical incident they have ever experienced.
